# **Bike Friendly Community Racks Up Another Victory**

Another victory for Sustainable Stillwater MN's Bicycle Friendly Community workgroup, which aims to encourage biking as a carbon-free form of transportation. The City with our help received a SHIP grant for new bike racks downtown — the Stillwater Public Works Department installed these on Nelson St., and Myrtle & Main Sts. This is just a start -- more bike parking is still needed. We have also applied to be designated a Bike-Friendly City from the League of American Bicyclists. The application was submitted and is waiting for December review. Rick Heidick, team leader, says bike education for schools is also needed and some trails in the area still need connectivity. The Board of Directors has endorsed GreenStep Team Leader Linda Countryman's proposal to push the city to create a Climate Action Plan, much like citizen activists in other surrounding cities have done. ### So.....How Did Our Legislators Vote On Climate?

Sustainable Stillwater MN values civic engagement and believe it's our duty to inform you about the status of legislation that could directly affect our environment and our ability to fight the worst effects of climate change.

Stillwater's state legislators from Minnesota Senate and House District 39 are Senator Karin Housley (R-39), House Rep. Bob Dettmer (R-39A), and House Rep. Shelly Christensen (D-39B). Here is their voting record on some of the bills.

In short, Rep. Shelly Christensen voted consistently in favor of climate, environment, and clean energy legislation. She voted YES on the Commerce and Energy Omnibus Bill, HF6, which takes steps toward securing Minnesota's transition to clean energy; she voted YES to allow the MPCA (Minnesota Pollution Control Agency) to create its Clean Cars Minnesota rule that will lead to more EVs available to Minnesotans and less air pollution; YES on House SF 972 which makes progress toward limiting Minnesota's greenhouse gas emissions and transitioning to a clean energy

projects that prevent the creation of waste, also known as "waste or source reduction." Source reduction means reducing waste at the source and is the most environmentally preferred strategy. It can take many different forms, including reusing or donating items, buying in bulk, reducing packaging, reuse, and remanufacturing.

One-time grants of up to \$50,000 will be awarded to eligible businesses for expenses related to project plann.ing, equipment, supplies, and capital improvements that result in significant reduction of the amount of solid waste the business creates. Applicants must contribute a 10% cash match of the total project cost .Applications are due November 1, 2021.
