interest in working closer with Sustainable Stillwater MN to make the city more sustainable.

Among the first sustainable measures during his tenure will be a study of how more facets of the Complete Streets program can be integrated into local ordinances. This will aid in completing the requirements to reach Level 3 in the GreenStep Cities list of goals in 2022. SSMN is also continuing to work behind the scenes on a Climate Action Plan to be a part of the city's annual planning meeting in July.

SSMN has also added a new team, "Energy and Climate," led by Spencer Middleton, and "Community Cleanup," led by Sofie Cohen. We'll have more info this spring!

The "Natural Resource" workgroup, managed by Louise Watson, will break into separate groups:

- Bluebird Recovery Program for 2022 is being planned by Janet Kortuem.
- Rain Garden Maintenance will begin in March led by Ruth Alliband.
- Storm drain stenciling starts up in April with the return of Cameron
 Murray for areas draining into the river. SAHS ECC students and other
 volunteers will hold work parties in areas draining into lakes and
 wetlands.
- Caitlin Bergh will start up monthly "What's That Plant" events in early May as weather permits.





Stillwater Looks Favorably on a Climate Action Plan for the Next City Budget

and PaleBlueDot's Ted Redmond, teamed up on Dec 7, 2021 to present the case for a climate action plan to the Stillwater City Council. We all must act urgently to avert the worst of climate change, reduce our carbon emissions, and pursue new clean energy and economic opportunities, Sustainable Stillwater's Linda Countryman argued. We asked the City Council to vote on an application for a grant from the MPCA to get seed money for the climate action plan, but unfortunately, they declined. The reasoning was that the city has too many other projects on Community Development Director Tim Gladhill's plate. Mayor Ted Kozlowski said at the meeting that he's excited to work with Sustainable Stillwater MN on a climate action plan because we have "reached a tipping point" on climate, and said the plan "needs to happen, just not right now."

Gladhill said they would consider putting a climate action plan into the 2023 budget at their July planning meeting.

Thank you Rick! All the efforts of Rick Heidick of Sustainable Stillwater MN's Bicycle Friendly Community Workgroup, with cooperation from volunteers and city officials, have paid off! The League of American Bicyclists has certified Stillwater as a bronze-level Bicycle Friendly Community, making us the 33rd Minnesota's community to receive this distinction.

What does this mean for our fair city? Something for everyone. More business for the business community. Tourism helps our economy. More bike amenities and services. Publicity on the League's website. SSMN is committed to working with the city and county for more trailheads, more off-road trails, designated bike routes on city streets, and more bike parking racks, more bicycle education (for youth, adults, and motorists), and more bike lanes markings and connectivity.

Browns Creek Trail and the Loop Trail are shining star attractions for our city. The winter Fat Tire race and the summer Bridge the Valley Bike Rally are now expected to be annual events. By enhancing the culture of bicycling in Stillwater, especially with a focus on safety and inclusion, the "livability" of Stillwater will grow, and Stillwater will continue to be attractive to residents and visitors alike. *See the City Council, Rick, and volunteers at the presentation at City Hall Dec. 21 on video here.*


