# Stillwater Migratory Bird Festival May 15, 2021 9am-1pm at Pioneer Park

Living on a flyway (St. Croix River) is one of Stillwater's charms. A wide variety of migratory bird visitors pass through our fair city twice each year,

Sustainable Stillwater MN is hosting a celebration of migratory birds at Stillwater's first Migratory Bird Day Festival on May 15 at Pioneer Park. This family-friendly event features a raptor "guest" from Carpenter Nature Center and tables sponsored by organizations devoted to wild birds including Master Gardeners, Wild Ones, US Fish and Wildlife Service, and the Sally Manzara Nature Interpretive Center in Lake Elmo. Bird hikes are scheduled for 7 am at Sunfish Lake and 10 am at Brown's Creek Park Reserve (meet at the parking area on Neal Ave), led by Linda Radimecky, interpretive naturalist. This birding festival is the prelude to Stillwater's becoming an official Audubon Bird City, which the City Council endorsed last year. Hope to see you there! # Progress with Carbon-Free, Safer Transportation: Bikes!

Council has passed a Complete Streets Resolution that shows their intention to take bicyclists and pedestrians into design consideration for all future road and street improvements and additions. Details are to be worked out in a July city planning meeting, but this is a good start. A "Complete Streets" policy meets GreenStep Best Practices Step 11.1-Transportation category, moving us up another rung in the state GreenStep Cities ladder. The City has also received a SHIP grant for new bike rack systems downtown — the Stillwater Public Works Department plans to install these by summer. And the City is finalizing the Chestnut Street Plaza design, which will create a very pleasing "mall" for pedestrians and bicyclists from the Lift Bridge and trails to Main Street. Kudos to the city for the progress on Chestnut Plaza to date, and for considering our suggestions for new bike racks and trail connections.

#### **Bike-Friendly Community Designation Sought**

Our BFC workgroup is also working on an application by July to get Stillwater certified and listed nationally as a "Bicycle Friendly Community" from the **League of American Bicyclists**. Such a designation comes with more tourism and economic benefits!





## **SSMN Pushing City To Upgrade Solar**

Sustainable Stillwater MN continues to urge city officials to get more of their power from solar. Meetings held over the last few months between **Buff Grace of Minnesota Interfaith Power and Light**, Sustainable Stillwater MN's Don Schuld, IPS-Solar, and City Zoning Director Graham Tait are part of an effort to encourage the city to invest in more solar rooftop technology or solar farm subscriptions. At the July planning meeting, according to Graham, staff will discuss increasing their use of solar with City Administrator Tom McCarty.

## in Stillwater with ADUs

Towns throughout the country are looking for alternatives to existing zoning laws that will allow more "Accessory Dwelling Units" (ADUs) to be built, increasing housing options and walkability and decreasing urban sprawl. Roger Tomten, Sustainable Stillwater MN chairman, and Todd Moss, a Stillwater resident, have drafted a Zoning Text Amendment to extend the construction of ADUs into other zoning districts in Stillwater. Language is also proposed to allow ADUs on smaller lots and to modify off-street parking requirements to make the ADU option more accessible to residents. The proposed amendments will be presented on Zoom to the City Planning Commission on Thursday, April 28th.

### **Clean Cars Decision Due May 7-ish**

The "Clean Cars" initiative proposed by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency to establish low- or no-emission standards for car sales in Minnesota hinges on the decision of an administrative law judge. The decision is due around May 7, according to Keely Cervantes, Conservation Minnesota, which has been active on this issue. We published an article in The Gazette to inform readers about the issue since there are a lot of misconceptions out there. The Clean Cars Minnesota standards have two goals — to reduce carbon emissions and increase choices Minnesotans have when shopping for new vehicles. We should know what the judge rules in early May.

## **Waterway Protection Underway**

Sustainable Stillwater MN's Natural Resources team's ongoing projects protect our river and lakes in three ways. Please consider helping!

Cigarette Disposal Units: Thanks to a grant to Sustainable Stillwater MN from the Keep America Beautiful Foundation, cigarette butt disposal boxes mounted on city light poles downtown are regularly being used by smokers and emptied by volunteers and store owners. Cigarette butts are unsightly litter but even worse -- the butts contain toxic ingredients that fall into the drains leading to the St. Croix River. Look for those cigarette containers if you are a smoker. Thanks to Bob Barratt for maintaining those containers! **Storm Drain Adoption:** Just grab a broom and sweep your curb gutter whenever you see dirt, leaves, or pine needles collecting. Then compost or bag it for Waste Management. Otherwise, it will wash into the nearest storm drain. Case in point: McKusick Lake's north end is getting dredged this spring due to the accumulation of debris over the years coming in from storm drains at a budgeted cost of over \$500,000. Save waterways and tax dollars by adopting your local storm drain. Orphan drains in need of adoption are everywhere; choose one closest to you at **Adopt a drain here.** 

**Rain Garden Adoption:** Rain gardens installed along streets are an asset to both the landscape and the water bodies that receive storm water
